








- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- ♣ BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. There have been 1.49 million results received since January 1st, of which 86,000 have come in the last 7 days. Since the beginning of the voluntary phase in 2012 6.43 million results have now been received.
- The graph shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2014 compared with 2015.

Registering Calves

- As peak spring calving has now passed on many dairy and beef farms around the country, it is important that farmers do not lose sight of the importance of recording important breeding data. ICBF acknowledges that spring can be a busy and stressful time for farmers with an endless list of tasks to be done. However, ensuring that data (namely sires and calving ease) is recorded comprehensively and accurately is vital, not only to the work that ICBF does, but also to the development of our Agri-food industry going forward.
- Better data recording leads to more accurate genetic indexes. This will in turn lead to more informed breeding decisions which will leave more profitable stock on farms and increase output at both farm and processor levels. For this reason, people across the industry that find themselves in regular contact with farmers e.g. agri advisors, breed society representatives, AI company reps & technicians etc. need to constantly stress the importance of recording basic breeding information when registering calves.







Any farmers that still register calves on the white cards which come with the tags, should be encouraged to switch to an animal events book or, where possible, to register calves online through www.agfood.ie or via farm software. The animal events book and online methods allow for much more comprehensive data recording at calf registration. Animal events books can be ordered by calling 1850 625 626. Online registration can be set up by going to the Department of Agriculture & Food website (www.agfood.ie) or by contacting your farm software provider.

Breeding Season

♣ As the Spring AI season commences we remind farmers to ensure that serves are recorded and reach the ICBF database. Heats not served and stock bull serves can also be recorded. See help document on recording serves below.



Beef Data Programme 2014

Farmers are reminded to input any missing data that is required for the 2014 BDP scheme. This data can be recorded through the ICBF website, farm software packages or on paper forms. The deadline for recording information for calves born before November is the 30th April. The deadline for calves born in November and December is when the calf reaches 6 months of age. Calves born in December will be hitting 5 months of age during the month of May and will be old enough to record quality, docility and any scour or pneumonia events. It is important that farmers do not forget any of these calves.

♣ Dairy farmers can run their weekly fertility reports to monitor submission rates during the breeding season.







Contract Rearing Herds

A facility is now in place for contract reared animals to be made available to the owners herd profiles and reports. The person whose herd the animals are being contract reared in must login to their HerdPlus profile and give the owner access to the animals. The facility is available under the admin dropdown of the HerdPlus login screen.

LambPlus data entry

- The deadline for entry of LambPlus data has passed as of yesterday April 30th. The Irish Texel society deadline for birth notifying their pedigree lambs was also April 30th. LambPlus breeders can continue to add lambs to the system, but these lambs will not receive €uroStar evaluations in 2015. Texel breeders are the exception to this rule, the Sheep Ireland recording screens will not allow these breeders to enter any 2015 lambs. Texel breeders that have failed to record their lambing data before the April 30th should contact the society directly.
- As mentioned above, sheep breeds apart from Texel partaking in LambPlus can continue to enter lambing data and these lambs will receive £uroStars in 2016. Over 3,000 individual lambs were entered onto the Sheep Ireland database on the day of the deadline. We will be contacting breeders over the coming number of weeks to address any issues that may exist with the data. We also encourage breeders to contact us, should they need help rectifying any problems.

Hill sheep performance recording

Many of the hill farmers that signed up to record parentage data on their lambs in 2015 are just finishing up their lambing season now. Over 85 Blackface Mountain flocks have identified a nucleus of purebred ewes upon which to build this parentage recording. Each of these breeders have been provided with individual access to their respective flocks on www.sheep.ie. In the past week we have also circulated paper lambing sheets to each of these breeders, which provides a second option to record this valuable parentage. This data will form the basis of future performance recording and breed improvement within the Blackface Mountain breed.


