
Some of the key items from this week's board meeting included:


- Update on the finances and the challenging year that farmers are having on the ground, resulting in reduced demand for AI and Milk Recording.

3 ICBF AGM – 2nd May


- The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2012 born calves with meal introduced is 621,644 with the number of animals weaned at 545,180.







- BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. There have been 1,420,000 results received since January 1st, of which 77,000 have come in the last 7 days. Since the beginning of the voluntary phase in 2012 1.91 million results have now been received.
- **4** The graph below shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2013 compared with 2012.
- This week there were 812 weights received through the technician service and 2,021 weights recorded by farmers. The graph shows the week and year to date totals.



5 Sheep Ireland

- 4 This week Sheep Ireland Staff were present at a number of different events around the country. On Monday, we travelled to Tullamore to meet with the Belclare Sheep Society. We have recently carried out some inbreeding analysis for the society and we wanted to ensure that breeders were clear on what the results meant. Sinead McPharland of Teagasc (who has published a number of papers on inbreeding in Ireland, mainly dairy & beef studies) and Noirin McHugh (Teagasc geneticist) were in attendance to answer questions from breeders. There was good discussion in relation to the potential problems that can occur when inbreeding is not managed appropriately.
- Each Belclare breeder has been provided with information detailing the current level of

inbreeding in their flock, this is just an across flock average. Step 1 is assessing if an issue exists. Step 2 will involve looking at ewes on an individual basis in each flock, to combat inbreeding, flock owners will need to carefully manage their breeding rams and ensure closely related females are not mated with them. The breeding population of purebred Belclare ewes is limited, and new bloodlines from other countries will never be available to the breed, as result, it is of major importance that we do all we can to prevent inbreeding issues for the breed, while also maintaining as much genetic progress as possible.

On Wednesday 1st May we were invited to attend the Roscommon Lamb Festival (<u>www.roscommonlambfestival.com</u>) which was launched in Roscommon mart. On the day there was a lot of activity, there were a number of breed societies promoting their sheep, in association with trade stands, but the main event was the sale of spring lambs which has become the target of many lamb producers in the area. Good







prices were reached on the day and the quality of lambs presented was excellent. The Suffolk Sheep Society presented ram sale vouchers to the producers of the six best pens of lambs. These vouchers will be redeemable at Suffolk Society sales where performance recorded rams are purchased.


