








- The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- → BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. There have been 3,326,375 results received since January 1st, of which 46,983 have come in the last 7 days. Since the beginning of the voluntary phase in 2012, 10,654,810 results have now been received.
- The chart shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2016 compared with 2015.

- ♣ Please ensure that you record dry off dates when you have dried off your cows. Here at ICBF we don't know the difference between a Dry Cow and a cow that you plan to milk through the winter! That's why you need to tell us. Farmers that don't record dry offs do not receive an accurate Annual Report for their herd or valid lactations for their animals that have paid for.
- Farmers can now genotype all their female calves which will allow them to make a more informed decision around breeding and culling potential replacements. 2017 LambPlus sign-up forms

- The sign-up forms are now being circulated by post to pedigree ram breeders all over Ireland. We will be sending them to all existing LambPlus breeders in addition to all non-LambPlus members involved in each of the Irish sheep breed societies. The number of pedigree ram breeders involved in LambPlus has grown every year since the beginning of Sheep Ireland and we hope that this growth will continue.
- We ask all breed societies to encourage their members to join LambPlus. Going forward, the €uroStar indexes will help to attract more and more farmers towards breed society sales and pedigree rams. This is not only good for genetic improvement, but also for breed societies and their breeders who are the foundation of the Sheep Ireland programme.

The deadline for receipt of these sign-up forms is Thursday, 1st December. This deadline will be strictly enforced. Sheep Ireland will be sending reminder texts to all existing LambPlus members in advance of this deadline and we will also be asking breed societies to communicate the date with all of their members. 
