


2 ICBF Board Meeting

Topics covered at the ICBF board meeting last week included:

- The decision to hold on the implementation of the Test Day Model and the plans to resubmit to the Interbull test run in January.
- ♣ Adoption of the recommendations from the Audit and Finance Sub-Committee around the 2014 budget.
- ♣ A discussion on the new Beef Genomics Scheme and the implications for ICBF in its role within the scheme.
- 4 A visit to the Tully Beef Performance Test Centre to see the progress made over the past 12 months, and the compelling performance results emerging from the testing process.





- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2012 born calves with meal introduced is 669,095 with the number of animals weaned at 629,717.
- ♣ BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. There have been 2,132,000 results received since January 1st, of which 14,400 have come in the last 7 days. Since the beginning of the voluntary phase in 2012, 2.62 million results have now been received.
- ♣ The graph below shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2013 compared with 2012.
- This week there were 1424 weights received through the technician service and 2333 weights recorded by farmers.

6 Sheep Ireland

Sheep Ireland attended the Charollais Sheep Society and the Belclare Sheep Society AGM's over the last week. Both meetings were very constructive and had drawn a good crowd hence these opportunities were great for both pedigree breeders and Sheep Ireland to discuss the LambPlus scheme. Sheep Ireland's Eamon Wall gave







an update on the LambPlus scheme, including the new minimum requirements for receiving €uro-Star evaluations and the New Inbreeding Checker that is ready to be launched next year. It also gave breeders a chance to ask questions regarding the €uro-Star system and any other queries they may have had. Any suggestions made at these meetings regarding Sheep Ireland or LambPlus are always taken on board and will be considered, as Sheep Ireland recognises that industry feedback is vital to the continued progression of this scheme.

Next week will see the last day for applying to and signing up to the LambPlus Scheme for the 2014 season with the closing date set for **December 15th**. Sheep Ireland has communicated this closing date through National media, the five LambPlus regional meetings and several AGM's, breed society representatives, and letters to pedigree breeders. Breeders that were recorded through LambPlus in 2013 also need to reapply unless they paid through Direct Debit. Any breeder that successfully paid using direct debit last year will have received a text on Thursday with next year's withdrawal date.


