


2 Database





- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- ♣ BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. There have been 1,929,000 results received since January 1st, of which 14,000 have come in the last 7 days. Since the beginning of the voluntary phase in 2012, 4.59 million results have now been received.
- ♣ The graph below shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2013 compared with 2014.
- This week there were 485 weights received through the technician service and 1387 weights recorded by farmers. The graph below shows the week and year to date totals.





3 Herd Plus®

- ♣ Co-Op performance reports for quarter 2 of 2014 have now been posted to farmers. All reports are also available for farmers to view online. The Co-Op performance report is a useful tool for farmers to compare the performance of their own herd against other farmers supplying milk to the same Co-Op.
- ♣ Dairy farmers are reminded to record any scanning data and to generate their final fertility report once this is done.
- ♣ Bull Tracker reports have been printed and posted to all beef HerdPlus customers. The bull tracker report gives a detailed overview of the performance of bulls that were either bred in a farmers herd and went on to sire progeny in that herd or elsewhere, or were bought into a herd and sired progeny in that herd. It is a very







comprehensive report pulling in vast amounts of data and has proven to be of great interest to both pedigree and commercial farmers. The report is also available for viewing online through HerdPlus logins.

♣ Beef Calving Reports will be generated in the coming weeks. Some changes have been made to this report such as the addition of some extra key performance indicators.

4 Genetic Evaluations

- ♣ Work on the August routine evaluation is on-going. Files have been received back from INTERBULL for milk production, female fertility, longevity, calving and udder health. Genomic evaluations will commence next week.
- Research work being undertaken at the moment includes work on the Test day model for milk production, carcass cut traits and meat eating quality.

Premier ram sales

- ◆ Over the course of the past week, the Suffolk and Belclare sheep societies held their Premier ram sales for 2014. Both of these sales were met with a strong trade from both pedigree breeders and commercial farmers. The trade for rams with high €uro-Star Indices in both sales was hugely noticeable. It was clear that rams with lower star rating values were not attractive to purchasers.
- Tomorrow (Saturday 9th) the Irish Texel society holds their premier sale in Blessington Mart. This year's sale boasts the highest number of entries ever, in association with this; there will be a huge number of performance recorded entries again the highest number ever in this Premier sale. 
