








- The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- ♣ BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. There have been 20,644 results received since January 1st, of which 20,639 have come in the last 7 days. Since the beginning of the voluntary phase in 2012, 7.34 million results have now been received.
- The chart shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2015 compared with 2016.

3 2016 Begins

Happy New Year to all our readers. As we start into 2016, it is clear that we have a very exciting year ahead of us, and a correspondingly huge amount of work to get through. This year, there will be focus on completing and stabilizing some of the recent projects along with ensuring that our routine operations are running smoothly.

A subset includes:

- The on-going rollout of the Beef Genomics Scheme and streamlining the wider genomics processes.
- Completing developments to the Beef Indexes (incorporating genomics) and rolling out the use of the indexes across the wider industry.
- Continue and finalise the review of the Gene Ireland Beef Program.
- Developing the Gene Ireland Dairy program and the support of the various AI companies in that regard.
- Continuing the research on the genetics of health and disease traits for dairy and beef cattle.
- Completing a base change for the EBI in the August Evaluation run.







- Evolving the current approach to dairy genomic evaluations.
- Finalising the research on cross-bred dairy genomics.
- Building a collaborative approach to maximising farmer engagement in the benefits of cattle breeding services, working closely with our service providers, milk and meat processors, and with Teagasc.
- Expanding the data collection and breeding information distribution infrastructure through HerdPlus, including new mechanisms of interacting with the ICBF database.
- Assisting AHI in the continued rollout of its national disease control programs.

Our sheep priorities are very much moving towards growing the use of the LambPlus and helping sheep farmers to make better use of the new €uro-Star genetic evaluations for sheep.

For both ICBF and Sheep Ireland, our priorities reflect the excellent opportunities that are created by the rapidly developing technologies in computing, genetics and statistics. We remain focused on our mission – farm profitability through improved breeding – and will continue the evolution from systems and structures developed in a different technological environment.

We again have a very ambitious program for 2016. It builds on the breeding systems and extensive database built up over the years. We look forward to working with the wider industry and Irish farmers and delivering increased value through our services and to overcoming the unexpected challenges that will inevitably arise in 2016.

5 Genetic Evaluations.

INTERBULL Test Evaluations.

↓ ICBF will send files to INTERBULL for the upcoming January test run for MACE evaluations. It is anticipated a base change for the EBI will be implemented in the August evaluation. Countries participating in INTERBULL must submit files to the test run ahead of implementing a base change. Milk production and fertility traits will be submitted ahead of the test run deadline on January 12th.

Beef Genomics

Test runs based on the December evaluation files with genomics included are now running for carcass traits and female fertility. It is anticipated results from this run will be circulated as test proofs in late January.

Foreign ebvs

New methods to incorporate foreign ebvs into the beef evaluations are being explored in order to harmonise the inclusion of this information in tandem with integrating genomic data.

7 Sheep Ireland

Happy New Year

Happy new year to all readers of this weekly update. We look forward to the next performance recording season with a lot of optimism and hope that we can continue to develop the Euro-Star evaluations in association with our LambPlus breeders and other industry partners for the benefit of all sheep farmers. There is some exciting times for the year ahead as the DNA from the Ovigen project is starting to be analysed in the lab, and no doubt this will also generate lots of challenges for the year ahead.

Lambing Season 2016

For a lot of breeders they are currently in the middle of lambing or wrapping up their early lambing ewes. We would encourage all breeders to get their lambing data loaded onto the website as quickly as possible to ensure they get a good flock DQI and so that if any issues araise with what has been noted down then it will be easier to remedy if it is still only shortly after the event. All farmers should have received there lambing notebooks by now and these can be used to aid you through this busy time. We would definitely acknowledge this is a busy time of year but if the laming information is regularly updated then it should not take that long to upload. It is recommended that all breeders refresh themselves with what is the required fields to be recorded. You can find this information in the front of the lambing notebook. The most common traits that breeders forget to record is:







- 1. Dead lambs & their weights
- 2. Fostering information
- 3. Pet lambs / Bottle reared
- 4. Ewes that aborted or Barren
- 5. Variation in Lambing Difficulty
- This is no easy task and hopefully commercial sheep farmers will continue to recognise the benefits of buying rams from these breeders which will help to justify their efforts.
- ♣ Some breeders have already stared entering their laming information so they are putting their best foot forward with regards to achieving a good flock DQI.

System Updates

- ♣ Sheep Ireland and ICBF are in preparation for a major upgrade of the computer hardware on which all of its services are hosted. This is a major undertaking and while every effort has been made to minimise disruption to our users, some downtime is unavoidable. The expected schedule for the upgrade is as follows:
 - From **Friday 15th January** at 4:00pm to **Monday 18th January** at 9:00am: The upgrade will be implemented. The website will be unavailable on these dates.
 - Monday 18th January at 9:00am: Services will resume although there may be teething problems.
- ♣ This upgrade will not change how screens are presented, only their performance.
- We would recommend that if you have anything of urgency to process using the Sheep Ireland website that you do this before Friday 15th to ensure you do not run into difficulties.
- The upside of this upgrade is that we will have the very latest infrastructure on which to run the Sheep Ireland systems, which means it, can work faster for you and have enough capacity to expand in the years to come.


