












- The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.

## 4 Sheep Ireland

- This week we travelled to Tullamore on Wednesday evening to meet with the National Sheep Breeders Association. There was some very good discussion centering mainly around STAP and the potential demand that will exist for performance recorded rams in 2013.
- There is no doubt that STAP applicants in certain areas of the country will have a large selection of LambPlus breeders and ram sale opportunities to source €uro-Star rams for STAP purposes. However, there are certainly other areas that are not well served in this regard. It will be of huge importance that all STAP applicants have a positive experience sourcing recorded rams over the next two years.
- Sheep Ireland have been present at many Pedigree ram breeder meetings in recent years and we are all too aware of the challenges facing these ram breeders. Many commercial sheep farmers have turned away from the traditional ram sale structure, for many different reasons. Task 1 of STAP provides all pedigree ram breeders with an opportunity to attract these farmers back to the sales ring, there is no doubt that pedigree rams have the potential to add huge value to the sheep industry, it is important that farmers attending these sales have a positive experience over the next two years. Otherwise this valuable opportunity will be lost.
- The greatest risk facing Task 1 of STAP is that commercial farmers will have difficulty sourcing performance recorded pedigree rams. It is the responsibility of all our breed societies to ensure that this does not happen. Sheep Ireland will do everything in our power to help breeders maximise this great opportunity.



- ♣ 706 herds are signed up taking a total of 24,487 straws.
- ♣ The average EBI of the Holstein-Friesian panel is €275.
- ♣ Allocations will increase in the coming weeks as straws become available.

## 6 Genetic Evaluations

- Extraction files for the April evaluation are on-going. Dairy female fertility and milk production evaluations will commence next week ahead of submission for the routine Interbull evaluations.
- A request for updated foreign breeding values for beef sires has been made to the relevant organisations in France, UK and Belgium ahead of the upcoming April update of beef indexes.







The results of the mini-run for beef animals linear scored up to 19th January were loaded to the database on Wednesday of this week. A new run will now commence with an update for animals scored up to 15th March. This run will see the introduction of the new rules where all eligible pedigree animals on the farm in the age range (250-350 days) must be presented for scoring.


