








- The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- → BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. There have been 1,360,678 results received since January 1st, of which 115,545 have come in the last 7 days. Since the beginning of the voluntary phase in 2012, 13,282,187 results have now been received.


