







1 Important Dates

- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. There have been 111,630 results received since January 1st, of which 71,075 have come in the last 7 days. Since the beginning of the voluntary phase in 2012, 11,268,030 results have now been received.
- ♣ The chart shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2017 compared with 2016.

3 Herd Plus®

- The latest evaluation figures (Euro-Star and EBI figures) have now been updated and are available to view on every animal in your HerdPlus profiles, Animal Search, Mart Boards, etc. AI bulls have also been updated.
- We are delighted to introduce our new Animal Search mobile app. This new app will now allow herdowners quick access to the ICBF Animal Search through this new mobile app. The Animal Search allows ICBF users to search for males and females in HerdPlus/BDGP herds.







- The 2015 most popular beef AI sires that were used in suckler herds have now been revealed. These lists see a Limousin bull HCA (Hauteclair) come to the top siring a total of 9,763 calves in suckler herds 2015. Click here for more information.
- ♣ Please ensure that you record dry off dates when you have dried off your cows. Here at ICBF we don't know the difference between a Dry Cow and a cow that you plan to milk through the winter! That's why you need to tell us. Farmers that don't record dry offs do not receive an accurate Annual Report for their herd or valid lactations for their animals that they have paid for.
- ♣ Herd-owners can now genotype all their female calves which will allow them to make a more informed decision around breeding and culling potential replacements. This service could cost herd-owners as little as €22/head. Please contact HerdPlus on 1850 600 900 or 023 8820452 for further details. Preparation for CPT Lambing 2017

The lead in to CPT lambing has already begun and the biggest challenge each year is locating an adequate amount of labour to help with this intense period of lambing. Using AI helps to condense the lambing period and essentially eliminate the effects that things like climate can have on lamb performance in early







life. When lambs are all born in a tight window, they are exposed to the same conditions, which greatly aids our ability to evaluate and compare their performance fairly.

Lambing Experience Available

- Each year a number of students join us for the CPT lambing window to gain experience and none have been disappointed to date. With up to 100 ewes lambing down in a single 24 hour period on individual farms, there is certainly plenty of action and a huge amount of learning is condensed into a very short period. Of course there is also a lot of data recording to do and these skills are extremely useful too, especially for anyone hoping to pursue a career in the livestock industry, as data recording continues to become an integral part of the Irish agri industry.


