








- The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. There have been 2,175,108 results received since January 1st, of which 15,282 have come in the last 7 days. Since the beginning of the voluntary phase in 2012, 11,705,339 results have now been received.

On Thursday 14th September the board of Sheep Ireland met. A number of topics were discussed at this meeting including;

- The LambPlus sale 2017

- Genetic evaluations developments
 - Testing across breed indexes later this year/early 2018
 - Testing genomic breeding indexes
 - Updating the Bio-economic model which is used in the SI indexes


