








- ➡ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- → BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. There have been 3,441,942 results received since January 1st, of which 52,997 have come in the last 7 days. Since the beginning of the voluntary phase in 2012, 10,770,377 results have now been received.

3 Herd Plus®


- HerdPlus Dairy Pocket Notebooks are currently being generated and will be arriving on farm over the coming weeks.
- ♣ The ICBF animal search is now available in app format on apple's app store. You can download this app by searching for 'ICBF Animal Search'
- The National sire recording stats have now been released. The most visible pattern that can be seen from these results is that there is 63.4% of the national dairy herd sired by AI. There is 16.8% of the national dairy herd with a missing sire and there is 19.9% of the national dairy herd sired by a Stockbull. For more on this click here
- ♣ All new animal events books have now been sent out to herd-owners to cater for the new tagging system.







- We are pleased to announce that ICBF HerdPlus have won the Agribusiness of the Year for Excellence in the Provision of Professional Services. This is nice recognition for the hard working team at ICBF. Also congratulations to Sheep Ireland for also making the shortlist.
- ♣ Please ensure that you record dry off dates when you have dried off your cows. Here at ICBF we don't know the difference between a Dry Cow and a cow that you plan to milk through the winter! That's why you need to tell us. Farmers that don't record dry offs do not receive an accurate Annual Report for their herd or valid lactations for their animals that they have paid for.
- ♣ Herd-owners can now genotype all their female calves which will allow them to make a more informed decision around breeding and culling potential replacements. This service could cost herd-owners as little as €22/head. Please contact HerdPlus on 1850 600 900 or 023 8820452 for further details. 4 Beef Data and Genomics Programme (BDGP)

- **Survey Data:** Survey data should be recorded online (www.agfood.ie or via farm software) or on paper survey forms posted to participants. Remember additional data (docility, quality, scour and pneumonia) must be recorded for calves when they reach 5 months of age.
- **DNA Samples:** Participants must return DNA samples (tissue tag or hair card) for 60% of their reference number. For replacement of DNA samples for animals sold or dead please contact **1850 625 626**.
- **← Carbon Navigator:** Participants must ensure that they have completed a Carbon Navigator with an approved adviser (list available at www.agriculture.gov.ie/beefschemes). The new extended deadline for completion of the carbon navigator is 30 November 2016.

- ♣ Sign Ups are continuing for the Gene Ireland Beef programme.
- ♣ 160 herds taking a total of 2320 straws have joined so far.
- ♣ The average order is 14 straws per herd.


