








- The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- ♣ BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. There have been 1.86 million results received since January 1st, of which 33,000 have come in the last 7 days. Since the beginning of the voluntary phase in 2012, 6.81 million results have now been received.
- ♣ The graph shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2014 compared with 2015.

- ♣ 327 Pedigree animals were scored in May. This is down by 65 animals from May 2014.
- ≠ 597 Pedigrees were weighed in May. This is down by 27 animals from May 2014.

5 Herd Plus®

Top 200 Herds

- Pat Flynn, Kilworth, Co. Cork has now reached €239 on our 'Top 200 Herds on EBI' listing and remains on top of the list. Kieran Hearne, Carrick-on-Suir, Co. Waterford has jumped to second position with an EBI of €228 while Martin Kinane remains at number 3 on the list with an EBI of €225. A notable entry at number 13 on the list is Tomas Roche, Kilwatermoy, Tallow, Co. Waterford who is a new entrant Dairy farmer with an EBI of €212. There are now 44 herds with an EBI of €200 or more. This top 200 saw 24 herds make the list for the first time with 79 herds climbing up the ranks.
- To access the Top 200 herds, click on the following link <u>Top 200 Herds on EBI</u> The average EBI of the Top 200 herds is €195(up €7) with €59 coming from the Milk Sub-Index and €104 from the Fertility Sub-Index. This compares with a national average of €131 (Milk €37, Fertility €78) see table below.




Beef Data Programme 2014

Farmers that participated in this scheme should record any outstanding data as soon as possible. Data can be recorded through the ICBF website, farm software packages or on paper forms. The deadline for calves born in November and December is 30th June 2015. All 2014 born calves are now old enough to record quality, docility and any scour or pneumonia events. It is important that farmers do not forget any of these calves.

Bull Search Views

↓ Views to the bull search are increasing year on year. The number of views to dairy bulls on the bull search has increased by 10% when compared with last year. Views to beef breed bulls, has increased by a massive 17%! This rise could be largely attributed to the increased focus on stars as a result of the new Beef Data & Genomics Programme (BDGP).

6 Genetic Evaluations

Yesterday a meeting of the Scientific Advisory Committee that advises ICBF on technical aspects related to genomic selection took place. An update on the current research was presented by Donagh Berry to the group. The research, which is using the data collected as part of the 2014 Beef Genomic Scheme is progressing very well, and indicates that genomics will add to the accuracy of the genetic evaluations. Once the research is concluded, test proofs will be generated for animals for discussion with the industry. The volumes of genotyping done in beef to date and likely to occur in the future as part of BDGP puts Ireland firmly at the forefront of genomic selection in beef worldwide.

8 Sheep Ireland

- ♣ Sheep Ireland is on site in Teagasc Athenry today (Friday 19th) in preparation for tomorrow's major sheep event. There will be a range of attractions to cater for all sheep enthusiasts. The themed villages will be one of the main attractions and this is where Sheep Ireland will be involved in the Breeding Village and the Hill Sheep Village. 
