





- BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. There have been 2,020,000 results received since January 1st, of which 13,000 have come in the last 7 days. Since the beginning of the voluntary phase in 2012, 4.68 million results have now been received.
- **4** The graph below shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2013 compared with 2014.
- This week there were 1045 weights received through the technician service and 2122 weights recorded by farmers. The graph below shows the week and year to date totals.



3 Herd Plus®

Dairy Calving Reports are now available online for all Dairy HerdPlus customers to view. This report allows farmers to assess the calving performance of their herd through some Key Performance Indicators (KPI's) such as calving interval and six week calving rate. It is important that farmers take note of their own figures and compare them to national averages as well as the top herds.







- LICBF will be present at the National Ploughing Championships this year as part of the Irish Farmers Journal/ICBF/Bord Bia Livestock Demo. The use of €uro-Star Indexes to select stock will be covered on the beef side while the benefits of high EBI cows will be covered on the dairy side. The demos will take place on each of the three days at 10am, 12pm and 2pm. It should be a very comprehensive and informative demonstration. We look forward to seeing you there.
- A beef breeding seminar took place in Kilmallock mart on Thursday night 18th September. The event was organised by Pat Blackwell of Teagasc in conjunction with ICBF, Bova AI, Dovea Genetics and Munster AI. It proved a huge success with a large crowd in attendance. Presentations were given by Dr Donagh Berry of Teagasc (Genetics & Genomics), Chris Daly of ICBF (Euro-Star Indexes) and Dr Doreen Corridan of Munster AI (Bull Management & Functionality). Some high Replacement & Terminal Index bulls were demonstrated to the crowd. John Lynch of Dovea Genetics and Michael Clohessy of Munster AI had selections of livestock from various maternal AI bulls.

5 Sheep Ireland

STAP

- 4 At present the administration of the Sheep Ireland tasks within the Sheep Technology Adoption Programme is our main focus. STAP participants are currently submitting evidence of purchase for their €uroStar rams which they are required to use in Year 1 or Year 2 of the discussion group programme.
- The deadline for completion of all STAP tasks is October 3rd which means all facilitators are working at full capacity to ensure that all their group members have met the various requirements of the schemes tasks. STAP participants continue to purchase STAP eligible rams at breed society sales around the country. Demand for rams this year varies depending on the part of the country, with intense demand for €uroStar rams in some areas, and less demand in others. We are already receiving a significant number of queries from non-recording breeders who are interested in joining the programme for 2015, which is very encouraging.

LambPlus

Conce the 2014 ram sale season begins to wind down we will be making contact with all Irish pedigree ram breeders (currently recording & non recording), to detail requirements for the 2015 season. Our LambPlus service continues to develop and there are many exciting plans for next year. These new plans along with the minimum recording criteria for breeders to receive €uroStar Indices for their lambs will be outlined in this upcoming communication.

National Ploughing Championships 2014

Sheep Ireland will be attending the National Ploughing Championships again this year from the 23rd to the 25th September in Stradbally, Co. Laois. You will find us in the Sheep Tunnel run by the National Sheep Breeders Association and all the breed societies. You will also find us on the Irish Farmers Journal live demonstration stand where for the first time sheep will also be on display. The demos will happen at 10am 12pm and 2pm every day where dairy, beef & sheep will be discussed. Some of the topics covered will include markets, production systems and breeding.


