








# ICBF Weekly Update 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2013

- The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems. 4
- **.** In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2012 born calves with meal introduced is 668,137 with the number of animals weaned at 627,772.
- **W** BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. There have been 2,104,000 results received since January 1<sup>st</sup>, of which 14,800 have come in the last 7 days. Since the beginning of the voluntary phase in 2012, 2.59 million results have now been received.
- 4 The graph below shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2013 compared with 2012.
- 4 This week there were 1043 weights received through the technician service and 3359 weights recorded by farmers.

## 3 Herd Plus®

- ↓ Dairy pocket notebooks are currently being packed and posted to farmers.
- **4** Dry-off sheets are also being posted out with milk recording results.
- Farmers can use these sheets, or alternatively record dry-offs online through HerdPlus® or a farm software package.
- **4** It is important that farmers record dry-off dates so that milk recording data will be accurate.
- **4** The BTAP screens will be switched off over the weekend to allow for the verification of tasks.
- 4 It is important that all data is entered before these screens are switched off.

#### 5 Sheep Ireland

- Our round of regional meetings concluded this week in Ballybofey, Co. Donegal. The meeting was very well attended with over 65 in attendance. It was very promising to see the wide spectrum of people attending the meeting from pedigree and commercial sheep farmers as well as some of the facilitators and advisers from around the country. You can see the presentation that was presented at these meetings on the Sheep Ireland web-site under "Reference Documents".
- Sheep Ireland was also invited to University College Dublin this week to meet with the second year vets to give a breakdown of Sheep Ireland and what Sheep Ireland is trying to achieve. This was a very productive meeting and we also invited any students wishing to gain some work experience on some of our commercial projects to get in touch.
- ↓ Our attention now moves to preparing for the upcoming 2014 recording season. There are a number of AGMs taking place over the coming weeks, many of which we are attending to present some updates of progress with the breed improvement programme. Teagasc have also begun their round of Winter Seminars in locations all around the country, Sheep Ireland have been invited as guest speakers at many of these events which will help to further spread the message of the €uro-Stars to the commercial farmer audience.
- ↓ The deadline for signing up to LambPlus for 2014 is fast approaching and breeders have responded very well. With the increased commercial demand for performance recorded rams in 2013, no pedigree ram breeder wants to miss out for 2014, which is fantastic for the €uro-Stars. With so many new breeders getting involved in LambPlus for 2014 the importance of our minimum requirements to receive €uro-Star evaluations will be all the more critical in providing as accurate and truthful genetic evaluations as we possibly can for the industry.
- ▲ All participating breeders will be receiving a Sheep Ireland recording booklet in advance of the lambing season which will clearly detail exactly what is required of each breeder in order to guarantee €uro-Stars for their lambs in 2014.


