
#### 2 Database





- ♣ The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- ♣ BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. There have been 1,290,000 results received since January 1<sup>st</sup>, of which 68,000 have come in the last 7 days. Since the beginning of the voluntary phase in 2012, 3.95 million results have now been received.
- ♣ The graph below shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2013compared with 2014.
- This week there were 530 weights received through the technician service and 1362 weights recorded by farmers.
- The graph below shows the week and year to date totals.

#### **Beef**

- ♣ Sign-ups are continuing for the Beef G€N€IR€LAND Spring 2014 programme.
- 4 288 herds taking a total of 5250 straws have signed up so far.
- ♣ The average order is 18 straws.
- ♣ 4 bulls have reached the 500 straws target (ZAG, KZH, KCH and GKA).

#### 4 Herd Plus®

- Dairy breeding charts have now been posted to all HerdPlus customers. For those that ran sire advice this will be included on the charts. If farmers that didn't submit sire advice wish to do so now they can contact HerdPlus on **1850 600 900**.
- Updated evaluations are now available on EBI and €uro-Star profiles online. Reports will be generated in the coming weeks.
- ICBF will have a stand at the Emerald Expo on this Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> April at Cillin Hill Mart, Kilkenny. If you are in attendance on the day make sure to come and say hello to the ICBF representatives. They would be more than happy to deal with any questions you may have.
- A new and improved record insemination screen is now live on the ICBF website. The screen is more user-friendly, but also allows the recording of sexed semen use. See screen shot below for example of the new screen. It is important to note that stock bull serves can also be recorded on this screen. To do this, simply enter the stock bull's tag number instead of an AI code in the bull used section.

#### 5 Genetic Evaluations

- ♣ The monthly beef evaluation for linear scored animals has commenced. Results will be uploaded by 1<sup>st</sup> May.
- Preparation is underway ahead of the Tully discussion group open day next Wednesday week. 300 farmers are registered for the open day where topics such as €uro-Star indexes, the overall G€N€IR€LAND program, HerdPlus and genomics will be discussed.

#### **Beef Genomics Scheme**

- The first 27,000 tags will be sent to farms today and early next week. In total over 70,000 tags have been sent for printing to date. Once samples are sent to the lab and genotyped, research on beef genomics will commence.
- Work on updating the dairy genomic evaluations will commence in the next couple of weeks. These updates will include expanding the training population with new foreign sires, and cows and upgrading the genomic evaluation software to cater for the expanding numbers of animals being genotyped. We will also be doing a full analysis to date on how genomic predictions have performed for all traits in the EBI.

## 7 Sheep Ireland

- The **April 30**<sup>th</sup> deadline for submission of 2014 lambing data is almost upon us. Final reminder texts will be circulated to all LambPlus breeders today (Friday 25<sup>th</sup>). A number of extensions will be granted for later lambing breeders as we certainly do not want to penalise breeders that choose to operate these systems of ram production. However all early lambing flocks will be required to meet this deadline if they wish to receive €uro-Star evaluations in 2014.
- We also require breeders to notify us of their intention to carry out ultrasound scanning of Backfat and Muscle before April 30<sup>th</sup>.
- The reasons for these deadlines are numerous. By encouraging the early entry of lambing data to the Sheep Ireland database it gives the best possible chance to provide breeders with accurate evaluations. In previous years, lambing data was being submitted by breeders from January to July and this caused major problems, from a practical point of view and more importantly from an evaluation point of view.
- The lambing season has now concluded on our lowland MALP flocks and this data is being loaded onto the database today. This will be included in an evaluation run which will take place over the weekend. We are in final preparations to launch the 2014 Curo-Star evaluations on the Sheep Ireland online ram search. Due to the changes in how the Sheep Ireland Indexes will display from this year forward, quite a number of updates to our online ram search have been required. Once this work is fully completed, the evaluations will go live and will be updated online on a weekly basis. All breeders had an opportunity to request an early run of evaluations and we have been facilitating these requests over the past few weeks.


