

## Ultrasound Muscle and fat Depth Scanning (M&F Scanning)

This week marks the beginning of a busy muscle and fat scanning period for LambPlus breeders in the country. Two of Sheep Irelands technicians are currently out scanning some of this seasons lambs, after a successful correlation session two weeks ago.

## What is M&F Scanning

Ultrasound Scanning remains a vital component of the LambPlus performance recording scheme. It is a common management practice in all the top breed improvement programmes around the world. Measuring the muscle and fat depth in sheep is a reliable indicator of how much meat will be yielded from the carcass when it comes to sending them to the factory. 
