






1 Important Dates




2 Database





- **↓** The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- In the Suckler scheme, the number of 2012 born calves with meal introduced is 654,725 with the number of animals weaned at 597,159.
- ♣ BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. There have been 1,922,000 results received since January 1st, of which 16,000 have come in the last 7 days. Since the beginning of the voluntary phase in 2012, 2.41 million results have now been received.
- The graph below shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2013 compared with 2012.
- This week there were 908 weights received through the technician service and 3231 weights recorded by farmers.
- ♣ The graph below shows the week and year to date totals.





3 HerdPlus®

- Work on updating the HerdPlus BTAP screens should be complete in the next few weeks.
- Farmers and advisors will be able to monitor task progression and completion.
- Scanning screens are working and data can be recorded on these.
- ♣ Both beef and dairy calving reports will be generated over the coming weeks.

4 Sheep Ireland

- The 3rd Sheep Ireland sale took place in Tullamore mart on Saturday 24th August. There was an overall clearance of over 60%, which was lower than we would have anticipated, given the uniqueness of this sale high genetic merit, STAP eligible breeding rams available in large numbers. Unfortunately, at present ram sales across the country are struggling somewhat, a consequence of a very difficult spring and dropping lamb prices. This said, some breeds sold very well, most notably the Suffolks, where all rams found a home on the day.
- ➡ This week a Sheep Ireland publication on the €uro-Stars will be circulated to all STAP applicants. This
 document covers all aspects of the €uro-Stars and will hopefully serve to improve the awareness of what we are
 doing and what we are hoping to achieve for the industry.
- Important events for the coming week include the two Better farm sheep walks taking place in the west of Ireland. The first takes place on Monday (2nd September) in Mayo on the farm of James Lally outside Westport, the second takes place on Thursday (5th September) on the farm of Colm O'Donnell in Co.Sligo. Both events kick off at 11.00am and should be very informative. Sheep Ireland will have a strong presence at both farm walks and will be discussing the use of performance recorded Mayo-Connemara rams.



5 Genetic Evaluations

- Files are being created for the September Interbull test run on the 3rd September. The test run will examine the effect of a switchover from the current lactation based model based on a single average per lactation to a test day model which utilises several test days throughout the lactation. The effect of applying a new base change will also be examined.
- ♣ A research project has commenced looking at the genetics of Johnes disease.
- LCBF presented new genetic parameters for an across country weaning weight evaluation on Limousine at an INTERBEEF meeting in Nantes on Tuesday last. These results will be used in the upcoming test evaluation in September. If the respective members are happy with the resulting ebvs there is a possibility they may be released for publication in November. Attention now turns to the Charolais breed.


