








2 Database







- The stats above are compiled with the assistance of DAFM AIM systems.
- BVD test results continue to be received at ICBF and are being processed accordingly. There have been 2,768,181 results received since January 1st, of which 38,945 have come in the last 7 days. Since the beginning of the voluntary phase in 2012, 10,096,619 results have now been received.
- The chart shows Inseminations recorded on AI Handhelds in 2016 compared with 2015.

3 Herd Plus®

- The latest HerdPlus EBI reports have been generated and are now available online. They will be dispatched to herd-owners next week. It is important to remember that this run includes the base cow change which will mean that animals on average will appear to have an EBI of €71 less.
- → ICBF have added a new tab to the animal search facility ('Geno Eval' tab) to view the impact of genomics in the genetic evaluations. This new tab now gives users of the animal search the ability to view the impact of genomics versus traditional data.
- LCBF have updated the Beef Breed Percentiles. The new cut off for a 4 star animal across all breeds is €73 and the new cut off for a 5 star animal across all breeds is €1. For full information please click on 'Genetic Evaluations' 'Beef Results' 'Breed percentiles (Aug 2016) (Excel)'

2016 CPT breeding programme underway

→ Today (Friday 30th) is the beginning of the CPT breeding programme with sponging of ewes taking place on the farm of James Naper, Oldcastle, Co. Meath. This commences a very intensive period of sponge insertion and removal to synchronise the oestrus of our 2500 commercial CPT ewes. This synchronisation will facilitate the artificial insemination of all ewes with our panel of high replacement index CPT rams which are now almost assembled in Lyons Estate, UCD.


